My dear Sr St Dunstan [Morley]

I am grieved to hear that you are so poorly but <u>not in the least</u> <u>surprised</u>. Doubtless the paint & the close rooms have to do with your illness.

If you feel able to run sown to St Leonards come & get a change of air, & plenty of good food & porter! — a fortnight here would set you up for the winter. Of course I do not say that you are to come in obedience as you can best judge of your present state & of what would be best for you, and I do not see what need prevent your taking a fortnights rest — The weather here is very dull still it is less smoky that London — This is the suicidal month in England.

You know how glad I am always to have you here while at the same time I tell you to use your own judgment –
