Gentlemen

I beg to inform you that I am quite willing to have the water cut off from the Convent.

We have two wells, and various large tanks which receive all the surface water from the roofs and grounds supplying the cattle and the Convent. I am quite willing however to keep the supply to the Schools below the Convent and to be charged the usual rate of the Town. Before we were supplied by the town Water Works we were only in want at the Schools below & this during a long drought at Midsummer when our surface water pipes had leaked during Winter.

I think you have made a great mistake in your estimate of our use of the water. If you wish to make any demand on the builders you can do so but I have given them the use of our upper pond from which they can have a good supply all the year round.
