

Cornelia Connelly Scavenger Hunt

Objective: To learn facts about Cornelia Connelly in a cooperative manner.

Materials needed: Individual Scavenger Hunt questions on slips of paper, individual answers on slips of paper, and a sheet full of questions with empty spaces for the answers, pencils, plastic eggs which open (or any containers to hold the slips of paper).

Goal: To correctly answer all questions.

DIRECTIONS

1. Make (x) amount of questions and answers on separate paper about Cornelia Connelly – to accommodate the number of students in your class. See lists of questions and answers below. You can number the questions, but do not number the answers. The answers are numbers only for your benefit. Place answers in the plastic eggs and hide the eggs throughout the classroom.
2. Each player has a pencil, and receives a list of questions about Cornelia Connelly (with room to write the answers.)

3. The students are asked to find one egg.
4. After each student finds an egg, the teacher calls on a student to open his/her egg and the student reads the answer. The teacher then asks what question on their sheet corresponds with that answer; if the child does not know the answer, it is open to the entire class.
5. Once the correct question is chosen, each child writes the answer on his/her sheet.
6. The game progresses until each egg is opened and paired with the correct question.
