Preparation for H. Comⁿ.

1st Day

Eve of Com^{n.}

1. Offer your adoration with special reference to H. Com, & make at least 3 Spiritual Com. during it.

2. Visit Our Lady's Altar & offer her the Comⁿ you are going to make, asking her to procure for you extreme sorrow for all yr sins especially those committed since your last Com^{n.}

Resolve on the special fruit you wish to derive

<u>Choose</u> your patron, either always the same, or the saint of the day, or one who was particularly devoted to B. Sac. e.g. St. Bonaventure. St. Stanislaus, St. Aloysius. B. Margt Mary. &c.

3. Frequently during the evening, or on waking in the night, use ejac. in honour of the B. Sac. acts of fervent desire & longing chiefly. Let one of the last thoughts be to call to

mind the happiness which will be yours on the morrow.

<u>Morning.</u> Preparation Commence it by invoking our B. Lady & uniting the Communion you are about to make with her preparation at the moment of the Incarnation. This practice Our Lord himself taught to B.M. Mary. <u>Offering of Communion.</u> (Indulgence for using any forms of offering.)

O.S.Heart of Jesus I offer you through the I. Heart of Mary the Communion I am about to make for your most holy intentions in my regard, for a greater increase of love for thee in this sweet Sacrament for a more tender confidence in thee & for a greater zeal for my own perfection & for the conversion of all poor sinners & for the souls in purgatory especially the one which thou thyself wishest soonest to be released I intend my Jesus to offer it to gain every possible indulgence & to pray for all that is required in order to gain it to the full.

Prayer. Lord Jesus Good Samaritan I am full of fear at the sight of all my wounds & many miseries, but I will not despair since I know thou didst thyself say I came not to call the just but sinners. Now O Lord who has been a greater sinner than I have ? Who could have sinned more grievously & a greater number of times? Who could have abused so many lights & graces as I have ? Knowing then kind Lord Good Samaritan that I am & can prove myself the greatest of sinners the scum of sinners I have some hope & confidence because I know that for such as me thou didst come. Lord Jesus I long to leave my wretched state of misery, to leave off offending thee & by thy great grace to become pleasing to thee I have nothing to offer thee but

the desire to do better Water that desire dear Lord with the blood from thy wounded heart this desire & it shall bring forth fruit pleasing to thy palate,

Invoke St. Gertrude. Our Lord promised the grace of a fervent Comⁿ to all who asked it through her merits & intercession.

<u>At the rails</u> Lord remember I am the most unworthy and have pity on me for the sake of thy mother !

Beg the Angels to assist you in your preparation.

<u>Visit B.V.M.</u> Mary my own dearest Mother who didst prepare a suitable lodging for the Son of God in thy Virginal bosom, I beseech thee by thy love for the S. Heart of Jesus to prepare my heart with more than usual love & purity that he may be able to say when with me " My delight is to be with this child

<u>Prayer.</u> O my dearest Lord is it possible that notwithstanding all my unworthiness thou seekest a dwelling in my heart. Dost thou not know that my heart is small & divided between myself & creatures & that in my carelessness I have reserved but a little corner for thee This I confess to thee in the bitterness of my heart O Lord & am heartily sorry that it is so but with thy help it shall be so no longer. Thou shalt be its king & master & nought shall for the future abide there which has not passed in with thy blessing. Thou seest my will & desire but if thou dost not strengthen it I shall show myself again as weak as heretofore. Sweet Jesus by the love which drew thee to the bosom of Mary by the love which drew thee into thy sweet Sacrament & which has constrained thee to remain in it these eighteen centuries

Behold me O most loving Mother of God purposing to morrow to receive thy most blessed Son. I shall be afraid to present myself before Him unless you will deign to accompany me & beg Him to receive me notwithstanding my utter worthlessness. Speak my wants to Him for me, ask for me the wine of charity of humility of generosity of detachment, speak dearest Lady your Son hears even before you demand.

Invoke your patrons

O dearest spouse of my soul I have with the help of thy sweet mother tried to prepare myself for thy coming with more than usual fervour & yet by thee I may be deemed ill prepared on account of my little love. But forget if thou canst dearest Lord <u>who</u> it is that comes to thee Think not it is Sr. Clare but thy own dear Spouse of Montefalco. Remember the raptures with which she welcomed thee in the Eucharistic banquet, the love which burned in her heart that heart which she had rendered entirely to thee from the beginning Call to mind the delight which thou didst feel when reposing with her in each Sacramental feast & deign to remember me through thy love for her.

Go to the rails clothed with the merits of St. Clare & offer all her Com^{ns}. as part of yr preparation.

Listen to her ! " My child I will tomorrow present you with my divine Son. Prepare him a little crib within your soul, swathe him with the bands of charity, shelter him from the cold of a frozen heart. Press him to your bosom & say to him all that love suggests. <u>H. Mass.</u> Represent to yr mind the scene on Calvary. Consider your Lord dying & giving His life for you. Pray hard that you may not lose the fruits of that awful sacrifice.

<u>H. Com</u> St. Bonaventure counsels to meditate on a mystery of the Passion each time we go to H. Com.

<u>Examen.</u> Place each of the five parts of it in one of the wounds of Jesus. Kiss each wound before you finish.

<u>Med on Passion</u> All holy Souls have always given some time each day to meditation on the Sufferings of our Lord. It is of more avail than many other practices of piety. Our Lady herself counselled it to St. Juliana St. Theresa always called to mind the agony in the Gdn before going to sleep & she tells us the practice is greatly indulgenced. Our dear Lord will amply repay in the cold hour of death all who have remembered his sufferings

[This completes Reverend Mother Foundress's writing in the book. There are some pencilled notes, and the hymn "Lord for to-morrow & its needs " is printed, with the date-feast of St. Clare August 12, 1881. (After C.C.'s death) There is a membership card of The Roman Archconfraternity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, made out in the name of Sister Mary Clare, dated 12th June 1864, and although there is no date in Reverend Mother Foundress's hand, this membership card and the mention of <u>Blessed</u> Margaret Mary (beatified 1864) suggests 1864 as the date of origin.]

What idea have I of my Vocation? Have I strengthened it by the faithful accomplishment of my duties?

Have I for my Vocation the esteem that it merits, and the gratitude which it ought to inspire me with?

Is it my principal care to advance in perfection ?

Are my dispositions for amendment or for progress, the same as in the first days of my Noviceship ?

What progress have I made in Christian and religious virtues ?

Is my Faith simple, lively, and active ? My Hope firm, without discouragement or presumption ?

What is my love for God? Is there not in my heart some irregulated attachment to creatures? Ambition and sensible friendship always cause this sad effect.

Have I any zeal for the glory of God? Am I afflicted at the outrages that He receives ? Have I that delicacy of conscience which makes the good religious tremble at the simple appearance of evil ? Have I not committed many faults under the pretext that they were only venial ? Have I not exposed myself to commit grievous faults ?

Where am I as regards union with God, recollection of His presence, and conformity to His holy Will ?

Above all examine yourself on the efforts you make to overcome your predominant passion, on the progress in virtue, that you propose to acquire. Above

all, see, if you have not given yourself up way [sic] to discouragement, on account of the little result obtained

On Poverty –

Have I received, taken, bought or lent anything without permission. Have I not kept anything without being authorised

to do so, or anything to which I have an irregulated attachment, anything that is superfluous, or not conformable to poverty. In all these cases I must amend and return to the exactness of Holy Poverty. Do I take care of everything I have the use of ? as belonging to Religion and to our Lord. Do I love Poverty as a Mother, rejoicing to wear its livery. and to feel its effects? Does it not happen that I seek for the best for myself.

On Chastity

Am I faithful to guard my thoughts, my heart, and my senses. Have I never permitted myself to do that [sic] which has at least caused me trouble. Am I faithful in having recourse to God at the first attacks of the devil. Have I carefully withstood too natural affections? Have I avoided all familiarity? How do I observe Religious temperance? Do I do all that depends on me in imitating the Angels by the purity of my body and soul.

On Obedience.

Is there in my obedience the spirit of Faith, as well as in the Will and the judgement. Do I see God in the person of my Superior? Have I listened to their voice as to that of God's (this disposition is the soul of obedience) Do I do anything secretly? Do I obey promptly, at the first sign, and at the first sound of the bell? Have I renounced such an employment, or residence at the first order, or even at the first wish or desire, remembering that one must be indifferent here below to everything excepting the Will of God, which is expressed by the will of my Superiors?

Have I not on the contrary allowed myself to make reflexions, to criticise, to murmur, either at the order itself and its accessories, or on my Superiors, diminishing thereby in my mind and in the mind of others the respect which is due to them?

Is there frankness and love in my intercourse with my Superiors?

Am I faithful in keeping all my rules, or are there any which I formally exclude from my obedience, the violation of which has become habitual? Have I above all loved and esteemed the rule of Silence, so important for the Community in general, and for myself in particular.

On Humility.

In what dispositions am I as regards Humility. Have I wounded it by my susceptability, my vanity, and my haughtiness with my Sisters? Have I sought for esteem and praise, instead of seeking for humiliations, and forgetfulness? Have I acted from human respect? Have I not too good an opinion of my talents, and of my virtues? Have I not the custom of speaking of myself, and of excusing myself. Am I faithful in acknowledging my faults with simplicity, & in giving an account of conscience, with that humility and childlike confidence which is so much in the spirit of the rule? Am I not discouraged if I do not succeed, or if I am blamed? Do I frequently make acts of Humility offering to do those offices which are the most repugnant to nature? and accepting them at least with submission.

On fraternal charity.

I owe to my sisters, affections, esteem and the most tender and cordial good will . I ought to do my best to support union. Have I never said or done anything contrary to this duty? Have I given way to aversion, envy, resentments, anger, cotentions, and unkind interpretations? Have I given way to jealousy, and sadness, in seeing others [sic] the success, distinctions and even the good qualities of others? I owe to my neighbour, love, forbearance and forgiveness.

Have I not spoken evil of my neighbour entertained thoughts of revenge, given way to ill humour, or repeated indiscreet

sayings or have I said or done anything which I could disedify my neighbour or cause disunion? Have I been careful not to reprehend others, when I had no right to do so, have I criticised my neighbour? Is my affection for them founded on the love of Jesus Christ? Is it generous, effectual and without exception? Have I avoided those particular friendships which scandalise the neighbour, divide the heart, and withdraw it from God who wishes to possess it entirely. Have I thought of the unfortunate effects of scandal in a community, and of the of [sic] giving good example.

On Mortification.

Is there in my regard any relaxation concerning Mortifications? Have I fulfilled according to the spirit those rules which are the contrary to nature? What efforts have I made to acquire a perfect Observance of the Rules of Modesty especially my eyes, my walk, and all my actions. In trying circumstances, have I not given signs of impatience, anger, or at least trouble. Have I accomplished with courage and constancy the mortifications and penances which are customary in the Community. Have I applied myself above all to interior mortification and self abnegation. Have I made efforts to reform my character. How have I received the trials sent me by Providence? Have I laboured to acquire a perfect conformity to the Holy Will of God. Have I lived the Spirit of Mortification: that is to say knowing that sufferings are an excellent means to expiate faults, to root out vices, and to render myself like to Jesus Christ, have I loved and desired them?

On Spiritual duties.

Do I fulfil my spiritual duties with zeal & fidelity. Does it not sometimes happen that I omit them through my fault. When I have been obliged to defer them, have I not performed them carelessly, or even forgotten them. What about my meditation, the preparation thereof, am I faithful in following

the approved method, in making resolutions, practical ones ? What is the cause of my distractions ? is it negligence in the immediate preparation or habitual dissipation.

Do I make my Examens, carefully and with profit, especially the particular Examen ? What about my Spiritual Reading? How do I assist at Holy Mass? Is there any thing to amend in my Confessions or Communions, as regards my preparation. What fruits do I draw from them.

Do I recite my Rosary attentively What docility do I show in following the advice given me. Am I faithful in looking on my mistress as holding the place of God in my regard and How do I say my daily prayers, especially those before and after meals. What graces should I not receive were I faithful in doing well my prayers. and in being recollected as I go from one exercise to another.

When a girl has thoroughly gone through the training in cleanings belonging to the scullery & Dairy then she is ready to be taught cooking – 1st. in all the simplest forms, Baking Boiling & roasting – Breadmaking – making tea & Coffee with <u>boiling</u> water & not with water that <u>has</u> boiled or that is <u>nearly</u> boiling, but <u>actually boiling</u> at the time of pouring it on the tea or Coffee. and in these simple forms of first teaching how to cook she must beware of using <u>dirty</u> cloths or towels in wiping her knives spoons or plates - The Kitchen towels ought to be washed out with a little hot water every day after dinner except such as require boiling once a week in general wash. (Cleanliness Order and regularity – are the marks of a well governed religious house - and without these it is only worthy of annihilation – God is a God of Order – such as He is such is His House – Patience and Perseverance are necessarily linked in the bonds of union & very marks [sic] of God Himself
